





#### **Competition and Game Play**

#### 1. General Rules

- b. Ringette Canada's 2013-2015 Official Rules of Ringette will be in effect for this event with the following clarifications:
- c. In the U14AA, U16, U19 and 18+ divisions, the approved 30-second shot clock rules will be in effect.
- d. U16, U19, 18+ divisions will play a full round robin, wherein each team plays every other team in their division. Teams will not be required to play more than 1 game in a 2.5 hour time period, following the end of their previously scheduled game. Games will not start before 7:45 am nor begin later than 9:00 pm.
- e. At the end of the respective round robin formats in U16, U19 and 18+, the teams will be ranked in each division from first to last, using the round robin point structure. The first place team will have a bye into the finals. The second and third place teams will play off in a semi-final, with the winner advancing to the final. The loser of the semi-final will be awarded the bronze medal. The 4th and 5th teams (if necessary) may participate in a seeding game, as approved by the host Ringette Association.
- f. U14AA division will play in a twelve team format, with teams sorted into 4 pools of 3 teams in each pool, based on Provincial Champions and previous WCRC results to equalize each pool, and have teams avoid playing teams from their own province wherever possible. After the first pool round robin, teams will be resorted into new pools of 3 based on placing in the first round, where they will play two different teams in a round robin format.
- g. At the end of the first two rounds, the teams will be ranked in the U14AA division from #1 - #12, using the point structure. The top four teams will play in the semifinals, #1 vs #4, #2 vs #3, the remaining teams will play in consolations rounds; #5 vs #6, #7 vs #8, #9 vs #10 and #11 vs #12.
- h. Mini games will be played in all divisions if necessary

#### 2. Point Structure

- a. Teams receive two (2) points for a win and zero (0) points for a loss. The team with the most points in each division will be declared the top team in that division. The second place team is the team having the second highest number of points, etc.
- b. The maximum spread between goals for and against (visible on the scoreboard, used in goal and assist statistics, used in tie breaking, and posted as the "official score") will be seven (7).
- c. In the U14AA division, Provincial Champions will receive 1 point at the beginning of the Round 1 that will carry to their Total Points.

#### 3. Game Play

a. Length of games shall be two twenty minute stop time periods. Teams will be assessed a delay of game penalty

for unnecessary delays during stoppages in play. One warning will be given.

- b. Teams will be given a minimum three (3) minute on-ice warm up prior to each game. This threeminute warm up will start at the scheduled game start time or upon completion of the ice resurfacing, whichever is latest. Teams will only be permitted on the playing surface a maximum of five (5) minutes prior to the scheduled or rescheduled game time.
- c. In the event of unforeseen circumstances that affect a team's ability to start their game within 15 minutes of the scheduled start time, the Head Ref Supervisor (or in case of their absence a Ref Supervisor), together with at least two members of the Protest, Grievance and Discipline Committee, shall make a decision to default or to reschedule based on circumstances.
- d. In order to maintain the privilege of goal areas to defend to begin a game, the Home team starting goalkeeper must, upon entering the ice surface for the pre-game warm-up, proceed immediately to the goal area that the team wishes to defend.
- e. A one (1) minute intermission will be given between periods of play.

#### 4. Game Sheet

- a. All coaching staff that will be on the bench during a game must sign the game sheet 20 minutes prior to the start time.
- b. Coaches should indicate Captains "C", Assistant Captains "A" and Goalkeepers "G"
- c. Injured players that will be on the bench during the game should be marked with "Inj"
- d. A maximum of 5 team staff will be permitted on the bench. Excluding Junior Coaches, who will not count towards the 5 team staff must be recorded on the game sheet.
- e. Hostesses are NOT permitted on the bench

#### **Tie Breaking and Mini-Games**

#### 1. Breaking of Ties in Games

- a. All games will be played until a winner is declared.
- b. If the score of a game is tied at the end of regulation time, there will be one (1) overtime period, stop time, which will be sudden victory (i.e. the first team to score will be declared the winner). The overtime period will be twenty (20) minutes in length.
- c. If neither team scores during the first overtime period, there will be successive sudden victory overtime periods until a goal is scored to break the tie. The subsequent overtime will be twenty (20) minutes in length.
- d. Possession to start the first overtime period will be decided by the tossing of a coin by an on-ice official. The team winning the toss will get the free pass. The other team will get the choice of ends.

## **Tournament Rules**

- e. If additional overtime periods are required, possession of the ring for the opening free pass will alternate between teams. The teams will also exchange ends for each overtime period.
- f. Each team will be given one (1) timeout in each overtime period.
- g. A one minute intermission will be given between the completion of regulation time and the first overtime period, as well as for each subsequent overtime period.

#### 2. Breaking Ties in the Standings

When two (2) or more teams have an equal number of points after the completion of the round robin games, the highest of the tied teams will be determined in the following order and considering the "Official Score" of the games.

- a. The winner of more games between each other during the round robin will be declared the highest position. In the U14AA division, steps a-c will only apply when all tied teams have played each other.
- b. If still tied, the team having the greatest positive different between goals for and against in games between the tied teams in the round robin will be declared the highest position.
- c. If still tied, the team having the least total goals against in games between the tied teams during the round robin will be declared the highest position.
- d. If still tied, the team having the greatest positive difference between goals for and against in all games during the round robin will be declared the highest position.
- e. If still tied, the tied team with the least total goals against in all games during the round robin will be declared the highest position.
- f. If still tied, the team with the least number of penalty minutes in games between the tied teams will be declared the winner.
- g. If still tied, the team with the least number of penalty minutes in games will be declared the winner.
- h. If still tied, a coin toss will be used to break the tie.

#### **IMPORTANT NOTES**

- i. These shall be followed in sequence until the tie is broken (i.e. one team is eliminated from the tie). Once one (1) team is eliminated from the tie, the procedure reverts back to (a).
- j. This procedure, in most cases, will declare the team in the HIGHEST position. However, in some cases, the procedure will declare the LOWEST position between tied teams, and that team shall be dropped from the tie breaking procedure (e.g. the top two teams remain tied). In these cases, the procedure shall also revert back to (a) in order to break the tie between those teams, which remain tied.

- k. In all cases, the maximum difference (spread) between goals for and against in each game is seven (7) goals. This is the "Official Score".
- I. Following the completion of round robin play, should one or more team(s) be eliminated from medal round play as a result of the application of the normal tie breaking procedure (as outlined in a-h above) to ties with any of the medal round positions (as shown in Table 1), one or more "mini-games" will be played in order to advance the required number of teams to medal rounds.

#### 3. Mini-games

- a. Mini-games will not start earlier than forty five minutes after the completion of the team's involved in the minigames last round robin game.
- b. Mini-game meeting times will be set by the Host Committee and/or Supervising Official. All teams involved in the mini-game are required to attend.
- c. It is the responsibility of the teams involved to be ready to play at the scheduled game time. Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of the mini game(s) by the offending team(s). Any team forfeiting a mini-game will be eliminated from medal round play.
- d. A team required to play more than one mini-game will be given a minimum of fifteen minutes rest between games.
- e. Teams involved in mini-games will be seeded using the tie breaking procedure outlined in 6.2 a-h. The respective mini-game format will depend on the number of teams advancing. Appendix 1 indicates the format to be used dependent on the situation (where "x" indicates team positions in the final standings)
- f. Each mini-game will consist of a one ten (10) minute, fully played, stop time period. If the score of a minigame is tied at the end of regulation time, successive sudden victory overtime periods of the same duration will be played until a winner is declared. Free pass award and choice of ends for each overtime period will be as outlined under the normal tie breaking procedure.
- g. Playing rules for mini-games will be applied as though the game was tied at 0-0 with ten (10) minutes remaining in regulation time. The higher seeded team, following application of the normal tie breaking procedure, will be designated as the HOME team and will be awarded the free pass to start the mini-game and the choice of ends.
- h. At the conclusion of the mini-game(s), the final positions of teams advancing and teams not advancing to medal round play will be determined using the normal tie breaking procedure.
- i. Time-outs will be allowed for full time periods only.


